

THE MARKAZ COMMUNITY CENTER

The Markaz, whose name comes from the Arabic, Farsi, Hebrew, Turkish and Urdu word for "center," is unique in its cultural focus and goal of serving all students interested in Africa, the Middle East, and central, south and southeast Asia, as well as the American Muslim experience.

The center serves the community that identifies with or has an interest, scholarly or otherwise, in Islamic culture, the Muslim world, global Muslim communities and non-Muslim minorities within the Muslim world.

The resource center serves as an entry point for students who want to get more information about opportunities to engage outside the classroom with the cultures, faiths and peoples of this vast region. The Markaz aims to facilitate dialogue and discussion around the critical social and political issues that have been at the forefront of the national conversation since 9/11. The Markaz provides space to and serves as a hub for, the many students and student groups that identify academically, culturally and otherwise with the Muslim world.

Important Things to Know: Muslim Life on Campus

The Markaz is the Muslim resource center on campus and is an inclusive space that centers on social justice and community growth. Its balcony makes an excellent study spot.

Prayer on Campus:

- There is a prayer room you can access with a code, and a Wudhu station on the third floor of the Old Union building (once you exit the elevator on the third floor, the prayer room will be to your right).
- ❖ There are two Jumu'ah prayers (Friday prayers) held in the Sanctuary room on the third floor of Old Union – a smaller one starts at 12:25 P.M. (with salah at 12:45 P.M.) and the primary prayer begins at 1:25 P.M. (with salah at 1:50 P.M.).

Ramadan:

- Every day of Ramadan, there are boxed suhoor boxes that you can order from Stanford Dining. There are also iftars held every night, usually on the third floor of the Old Union.
- If you have a final exam/midterm in the evening during Ramadan, you can ask your professors to reschedule and they may accommodate the request.
- ALL beef and chicken in ALL of the dining halls is zabiha halal.




